### **FEATURED PROJECTS**

### Introduce kids to butterfly habitat

Burnett County Master Gardener Volunteers teach Webster Elementary School fourth graders the importance of milkweed as a vital habitat for Monarch butterflies. With the help of MGVs, students harvested milkweed pods, collected the seeds, and distributed seeds with instructions to families attending an educational open house. In addition, MGVs work with a teach on a farm to table concept in the school in order to bring fresh, locally grown vegetables to the students.

## Support Historical Society through gardening efforts

MGVs maintain multiple garden projects at Forts Folle Avoine Historical Park. To create a welcoming space, native and heirloom gardens surround the visitor center. Vegetables are also grown on site and used as part of a fundraising dinner. To raise additional money for the historical society, MGVs provide education during a plant sale to the public.

#### **Engage kids with plants**

In cooperation with the Burnett Garden Club, MGVs provide plant-based activities to kids and families at the Grantsburg Oktoberfest. MGVs enabled kids to interact with soil and succulent plants as they were able to create their own imaginative fairy gardens. They highlighted a make-your-own mini succulent garden which included little fairy garden type decorations. Projects such as this are important ways to introduce plants and gardening to kids, encourage creative expression, and generate positive family interactions.

#### Renovate food pantry garden

MGVs provide expertise and assistance to renovate the hoop house at Ruby's Pantry in Siren, WI. This allowed the pantry to continue to provide fresh vegetables and volunteer opportunities to their clientele.
