FEATURED PROJECTS

St. Croix Valley community garden

St. Croix Master Gardener Volunteers planned, planted, and maintained a community garden near New Richmond. The garden provided rental plots for gardeners and partnered with schools for service learning day, as well as other youth groups to teach them about gardening. A portion of the garden was used to grow over 1,000 pounds of vegetables to be donated to the food pantry.



St. Croix county fair

MGVs developed a display for the St. Croix county fair that featured gardening in small spaces and gardening with children. Two wood face cut-outs of a scarecrow and Peter Rabbit were made in partnership with a local school (shop and art classes) to attract families to the area. Fairgoers were attracted to the display where they learned various gardening techniques, especially related to growing in small spaces. Raised beds and containers planted in advance demonstrated how these options produced relatively large amounts of produce. Children were exposed to gardening in a positive, fun way.

Fundraising plant sale

SCVMGA hosted its annual plants sale in Hudson, where it raised over \$4,000. These funds are then distributed as community grants to a wide variety of projects throughout Pierce and St. Croix Counties. Over 36 projects were funded this year. The sale is also an opportunity to provide educational information to the public. Over the years, community members have come to know the plant sale as an opportunity to talk with Master Gardener and ask questions about a wide variety of topics. We have educational resources, such as fact sheets, on hand about timely topics. Because of bad Japanese beetle problems in the area, we educate people about the most environmentally friendly ways to deal with this pest.

Garden U(niversity)

MGVs hosted the annual "Garden U" educational seminar for the general public. This day-long event featured speakers, vendors, and educational displays. This year's theme was "Protecting Water Quality" and focused on ways to protect groundwater and surface water with various gardening and landscaping efforts. Over 150 people attended. Garden U helped people be more successful in their home gardening efforts. With St. Croix and Pierce counties having many water resources including high quality trout streams, and is bordered by the St. Croix and Mississippi Rivers, water protection education is valuable and imperative.
